Mom's Pantry Fundraiser

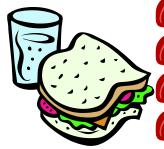
We will be hosting the Mom's Pantry fundraiser from November 1 to November 18. Our delivery date will be announced following the closing date, likely sometime in early December.

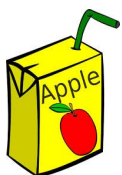
SLC Food Drive
